Our Clinician Portal offers a metasearch of over 100 clinical reference sources for patient care. Most of the biomedical journal titles are linked in PubMed via the Stanford button. When you are off campus, your SUNet ID is all you need to authenticate yourself & enjoy access to these same resources.

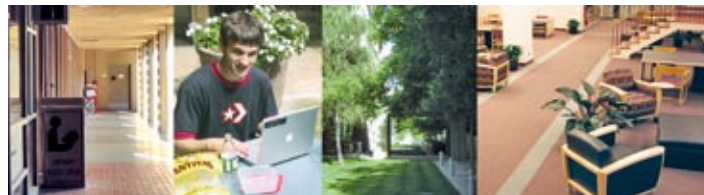

PubMed@Stanford

Access online articles directly from your PubMed search! Start from the PubMed link on Lane's web page or use the core search. Each citation displays the Stanford button.

Click on it to see a menu of choices – link to full text online, check the catalog, or request articles via DocXpress. Problems or questions? It's easy to email us, using the "Email Lane" link on the FindIt@Stanford menu.



Off-campus access

Your SUNet ID is your passport to online journals, databases, and Core Searches. At another hospital, at home, or while traveling, use Lane's online resources as easily as if you were on campus. DocXpress

Request an article from Lane via this service. If an article is not available on campus, our staff will order the article from another library. One-time registration for this service allows you to:

- track the progress of each request
- view the history of all items you have requested
- enjoy web delivery of articles

Scholarly Workshops & Classes

Lane offers free workshops and classes on finding, managing and presenting information. For example, you can learn how to search PubMed, save your citations in EndNote, present your findings using Powerpoint, and improve your writing skills. View the complete calendar and sign up for a scheduled class on Lane's website. Can't make the scheduled time? You can schedule a personal consultation or a customized group session by contacting your library liaison.

CLINICIAN PORTAL

The clinical core search jump-starts your search for information. You can simultaneously search over 100 important clinical resources, including PubMed, ebooks, UpToDate, drug information, clinical calculators, patient handouts, and images. Within seconds you retrieve a list of resources and the number of hits in each. A click of the mouse takes you to the information found in individual resources. Within PubMed, UpToDate, etc., refine or expand your search using the features of that individual resource. This core clinical search tool is in two places on any Lane Library web page: search pull-down menu & Clinician tab.



PEDIATRICIAN PORTAL

The Pediatrician Portal is a focused metasearch for pediatrics and searching selected pediatric resources. Under the Clinician tab, you will find links to both clinical and pediatric core searches and to additional specialty pages. Also look for pediatric core under Search on any Lane web page. We welcome any suggestions you may have for adding resources to these portals.

Easy Access Anywhere



AT LANE...

Have a laptop?

Register your wireless card and access the Stanford network anywhere in the Medical School*. Relax in a comfy chair in the library, sit in the shade under a tree in the courtyard, or work in any of the library study rooms where you will be able to access and use a full complement of information resources.

*The hospitals don't have wireless access.

Don't have a laptop?

Computer workstations are available for you throughout the library. We also have a station equipped with a scanner, Adobe Photoshop, and other graphic and office software.

Covered drinks are welcome throughout the library – coffee, tea, water, juice, etc., and food is allowed in the courtyard.

Lane's doors are wide open and everyone is welcome. No ID is required to enter the library – but please bring your hospital or university ID to register if you plan to check out materials.

OR AWAY...

I have used Lane Pediatrician Portal search off-campus without any problems. In fact, I have literally used it throughout the world – just a few days ago I did a search for jelly fish stings while in Mexico and was able to authenticate to UpToDate using my SUNet ID.

I was on vacation in Puerto Vallarta and saw several children get stung by jelly fish. I helped the resort doctor but was wondering what the real evidence was behind (for instance) urine, cold water compresses, hot water compresses, etc. As it turns out, there is little evidence for any of it except the hot water compresses, which seem to work better than any other type of pain control...

Pediatric housestaff definitely do successful off-campus searches from SCVMC and Kaiser using the portal as well.
