Q: Does Lane have my favorite eJournals and books?

A: Chances are good that we have them. Start with LaneConnex to find your title. We welcome your suggestions for additional titles if we don't have what you need. Simply click on the AskUs button and email your suggestion.



Q: Who can help with my research and patient care questions?

A: Your Lane Liaison is your personal librarian, prepared to help with all types of information questions. To find out who your liaison is, go to: <http://lane.stanford.edu/liaisons>. You can also stop by the service desk, phone the service desk, or send email to LaneAskUs@stanford.edu for help with questions.



Q: When and where can I do research or read articles online?

A: Online access is available 24/7. You can access Lane's digital content in the library at our computers or using your own laptop and the wireless network, throughout the medical center, or anywhere on campus. At home or on the road, use your SUNet ID for login.



Q: Why do I need a SUNet ID?

A: Your SUNet ID has at least two vital functions: it serves as your email address, and it is your passport to off-campus access to Stanford's online resources.



Q: How do I get a SUNet ID?

A: Incoming housestaff can create their SUNet ID and password, then request sponsorship from Ann Dohn in the GME office. NOTE: If you have had a SUNet ID in the past, you must keep the same ID; but you still need to request sponsorship. Students in summer programs have SUNet IDs provided by their programs. Additional SUNet ID FAQs are on the Lane website.

Start your research and reading here. Selecting eJournals, databases, and other online resources from Lane's website routes your request through Lane's proxy, so that the information provider recognizes a Stanford user. Search the portals on LaneConnex to jumpstart your search for information.

Off Campus Access

Whether you are at home, on the road, or at another hospital, you can access Lane's online resources simply by entering your SUNet ID. This ID also serves as your email address for house staff, students, faculty and university staff.

PubMed@Stanford

Click on Lane's PubMed button, then do your search. The Stanford button that appears with each abstract takes you to a menu which helps you find the article online or in print, or request it via DocXpress.

DocXpress

This service provides interlibrary loan for items we don't own and pull© service for articles available on campus. Sign up once, and all requests will automatically include your contact information. Most articles are delivered via the web, so you can pick them up 24/7.
