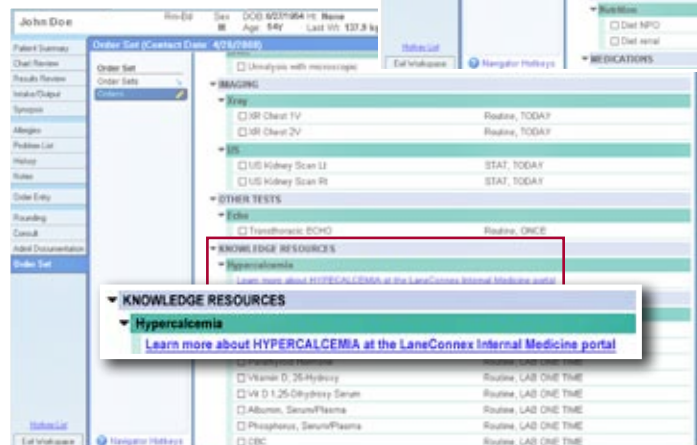

Finding the Best Evidence: An Introduction to Evidence-Based Practice Information Resources

Improve your ability to quickly locate and obtain the best evidence-based information to answer your clinical questions. Includes hands-on practice with the Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews, BMJ Clinical Evidence, ACP Journal Club, DARE and PubMed, including Clinical Queries.

PowerPoint: Level 1 and Level 2

Level 1 covers slide composition/design, and is designed primarily for first time PowerPoint users. Level 2 explores the use of multimedia files in presentations and PowerPoint template creation.

Finding Images and Videos for Your Presentations

This workshop will take you beyond the level of “optimistic amateur” and provide you with a core set of search techniques and a shiny toolkit of desktop utilities you'll find it hard to live without.

PubMed: Basic to Advanced Techniques

Discover the secrets of effective PubMed searching in this hands-on workshop. Attendees will learn how to use MeSH, Limits, Clinical Queries, Related Articles, My NCBI, and FindIt@Stanford to locate references, download full text, and create current awareness profiles quickly and easily.

EndNote: Bibliographies Made Easy

Part I provides the basics; i.e., creating libraries, importing citations and generating bibliographies. Part II explores customizing bibliography style files, use of manuscript templates for MS Word, citation annotation and much more.
