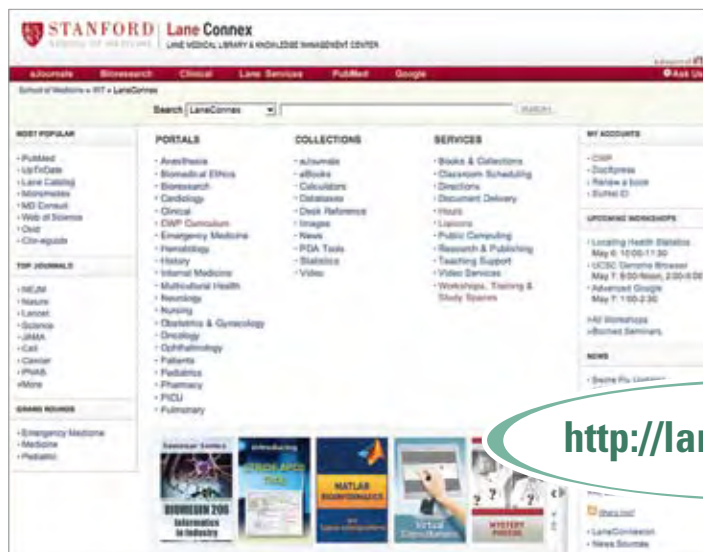

Start from LaneConnex to access PubMed, eJournals, UpToDate and other resources; this guarantees that the resource provider will recognize you as a Stanford user, granting access privileges accordingly.

PubMed Search Results Link to Full-Text Articles

Start from Lane's link to PubMed and other databases to simplify the process of getting the actual articles.

- 1 Do your search as usual.
- 2 Click on the title of the article. Do you see the Stanford button? Click on it. 
- 3 The FindIt@Stanford menu will offer a link to full text and to DocXpress, and to other services.
- 4 Follow the link to full text to obtain the article. If there are several providers listed, simply choose the one you prefer.
- 5 **No link to full text available?** Click the link to the library catalog. We may have the journal in print at the library.
- 6 **Not available at all?** Click on the link to DocXpress, our interlibrary loan and document delivery service. We can obtain the article from another library and deliver it to your desktop within a few days.

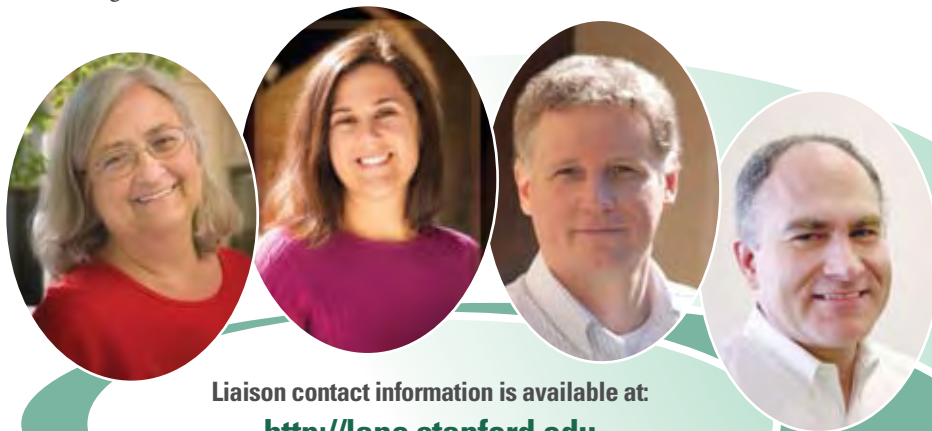
Lane Liaison Program
